Time is running out!

If you're a member of a Blues band, solo or duo act, or if you know of a Blues act who wants to compete in the upcoming DCBS Battle of the Bands or the Solo/ Duo Competition, the deadline is quickly approaching! **Deadline to** register is Wednesday, Aug. 14.

The competitions are scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 14 at American Legion Post 41, 905 Sligo Ave., Silver Spring, MD 20910.

The Battle of the Bands features some of the area's best musicians performing their best selections for one of the very best DCBS audiences. That's a lot of "bests" and they are all true! This is a prestigious, very popular event. Winner of this competition represents DCBS at the 2020 International Blues Competition in Memphis. In addition, the winner is paid



to perform at the 2019 College Park Blues Festival on Saturday, Nov. 9 and at the 2020 DC Blues Festival. Competition is open to Blues artists from the DMV and includes a CD review and a live performance.

Like the Battle of the Bands, the winner of the Solo/Duo

Competition also represents DCBS at the IBC in Memphis and is a featured act at the 2019 College Park Blues Festival on Saturday, Nov. 9.

The DCBS may also send a youth band or solo/ duo act to perform at the IBC in the Youth category and also will accept entries for the IBC's Best Self-Produced CD category.





The DCBS also may send a youth band or solo/ duo act to perform at the IBC in the Youth category and also will accept entries for the IBC's Best Self-Produced CD category.

Deadline for entering the band, solo/duo, and youth categories is Wednesday, Aug. 14, 2019. The deadline for entering the Best Self-Produced CD category is Wednesday, Sept. 25, 2019. The DCBS Battle of the Bands and Solo/Duo Competition comprise a CD

review and an all-live competition at the American Legion Post 41, 905 Sligo Ave., Silver Spring, MD 20910.

Winners of the Band and Solo/ Duo competitions represent the DCBS at the 2020 International Blues Challenge AND also are paid to perform at the 2019 Free College Park Blues Festival (an IBC Fundraiser) on Saturday, Nov. 9 AND at the 2020 Annual DC Blues Festival (subject to change). 

## **Carolyn Wonderland Brings Texas Sounds to City Winery**

Carolyn Wonderland is a multi-award winning artist from Texas. She won the Best Female Vocalist at the 2011 and 2012 Austin Music Awards, and she and her band were named Austin's Best Blues Band at the 2009 Austin Music Awards. She's been described as a "musical force equipped with the soulful vocals of Janis and the guitar-slinging skills of Stevie Ray...." In April 2018, Carolyn joined the legendary John Mayall's band. I talked to Carolyn before her show on Friday, July 5 at the City Winery DC.

**Pete:** Hello and welcome to DC! Where are you coming from today?

**Carolyn:** We're coming from Abington, VA last night.

**Pete:** I gotta start by first asking – how are you doing? I saw on your web page that you had hip replacement surgery recently and you were back playing in 3 weeks?

**Carolyn:** Yes, and I'm getting better everyday. I just did a long tour with John Mayall (46 shows in 55 days).

**Pete:** Is that why you're calling this the "Rides Again Tour?"

**Carolyn:** (laughs) No, it's because I don't get to play with these guys that often! (Introduces me to band members Kevin Lance, drums and Bobby Perkins, bass)

**Pete:** What did you start doing first—singing or playing guitar?

**Carolyn:** Guitar, trumpet; always a lot of instruments around the house. I always sang.

**Pete:** I saw you playing a Fender Thinline Telecaster. Is that your regular guitar? Do you have a Joe Barden pick up on it?

**Carolyn:** Yes I play a re-issue Thinline in this band and it does have a Joe Barden. I play a Gibson Blues Hawk with Mayall.

**Pete:** I saw you at the sound check playing a lap steel. What key do you usually play in? Selwyn Birchwood said he likes E. Megan Lovell of Larkin-Poe said she likes using a Dobro G tuning.

**Carolyn:** I like playing in G mostly. I get tips from Cindy Cashdollar. You should check out

**cindycashdollar.com** to pick up some things from her.

**Pete:** Looks like you have taken advantage of being in Austin to meet and play with a variety of players and different music styles.

**Carolyn:** I'm really not home enough, but yes, I've played with Marcia Ball and Ruthie and many others there.

**Pete:** Congratulations on being the lead guitar player in John Mayall's band! The first female lead guitarist in his 60+ year career! Gotta be a thrill and a story.

**Carolyn:** Thanks! We were doing some festivals together. I know his bass player, we were on the Rock Legends Cruise, and I was invited to join the band.

Pete: How old is he now?

**Carolyn:** John's 85 now, and he still does long tours.

**Pete:** Where are you going next?

Carolyn: Doing the next three weeks with the band including a few festivals and ending up in Mendocino, CA and then back with John Mayall. (Note: Carolyn will be with John Mayall at The Hamilton Live on Thursday, Aug. 22.)

**Pete:** Thanks for spending some time with me. I'm looking forward to the show.

Local favorites, The Bad Influence Band, opened the show with an energetic, swinging set featuring songs from their new CD, *Got What You Need*, as well as other numbers. Their trademarked great vocals, guitar and harmonica are held together by their tight rhythm section. Special thanks to Mike Tash for his nice "shout out" encouraging people to join the DC Blues Society! They closed with a rockin version of the Blasters' classic "Good Bye, Baby, So Long."

Carolyn Wonderland took the stage with Bobby Perkins on bass and vocals and Kevin Lance on drums and vocals, and they started off with a song co-written with Ruthie Foster. I was immediately wowed by the powerful vocals and fine guitar playing. I love Ruthie Foster, and this song sounds like a Ruthie classic. Carolyn brought more Texas-influenced music next with a Billy Joe Shaver song that featured her fabulous finger-picking guitar style. "Two Trains Running" started out slow and built up into a nice groove with powerful vocals, some scat-style singing and hot finger-picked guitar licks on her Fender Tele.

Carolyn did a Janis Joplin song I was not familiar with called "What Good Can Drinkin' Do" and what powerful vocals! It takes a lot of nerve to play a Janis Joplin sound and Carolyn just killed it! Next was a slow blues number, "Open Up Your Eyes and Shut Your Mouth" that featured more hot guitar and very soulful, powerful vocals.

Carolyn played a John Mayall song and she formed a circle with Bobby and Kevin and you could see everyone smiling and keeping a great groove going. A Bob Dylan song, "It Takes a Lot to Laugh, It Takes a Train to Cry" was transformed into a cool bluesy song followed by a swamp-rock Creedence-style song. She can play so many styles so well!

She brought out her lap steel for some screaming slide blues. and for an encore she closed with a Freddie King song that featured kick-ass guitar playing and singing with driving bass and drums. What a wonderful night seeing the Carolyn Wonderland Band for the first time. Don't miss seeing Carolyn Wonderland the next time she and her outstanding band are in town. She's the real deal.

Albert Castiglia (pronounced "kasteel-ya") brought his rockin' blues show to a packed JV's Restaurant on Friday, July 12. It's been awhile since Albert, who's based in Florida, has played at JV's and you could tell he was happy to see old friends and make some new fans.

Albert's excellent new band features Ephraim Lowell on drums and Justine Tompkins on bass. They started rocking with "Let the Big Dog Eat," a number that had the crowd dancing right away. He sprinkled lots of outrageously funny and some very sensitive stories throughout his performance.

Albert said he has been through many changes since he was last at JV's. He discovered he had a daughter and two grandchildren! Many of his stories are reflected in his new album, *Masterpiece*. He did a cool rockin' blues song, "Keep on Swinging," inspired by his 5-year-old grandson.

Lowell and Tompkins are new band members since the last time Albert played JV's and they received a warm welcome. Both are very experienced and fit right in. You can see they are in sync with each other and were always ready when Albert veered off to tell another story. He played a Mike Zito slow talking blues song "Quit Your Bitching" that had the audience laughing out loud.

While Albert plays a lot of rocking blues, he mixed up his set with an old swing number and also played Muddy Waters and Freddie King songs. The dance floor was packed all night. Albert is a very expressive guitar player, and it's fun to see his facial expressions as he plays with a great deal of emotion. You can

On Saturday, July 20, I was the lucky winner of two tickets (from the DCBS Ticket Giveaway) to

The Hamilton Live for the Sunday, July 21 show. The Rev. Peyton's Big Damn Band was the headliner for the night.

My reading of their bio on the DCBS website didn't quite prepare me for the reality of a current "country blues band." The name "Big Damn Band" must refer to the BIG sound generated by a band with only three members: the charismatic guitarist, Rev. Peyton; the drummer, Max Senteney; and a washboard played by the Rev's wife, "Washboard" Breezy Peyton. All were amplified to the max!

I took my daughter and her boyfriend, who is a blues musician, and we agreed that the performance was very engaging. They gave a very good show to a good-sized following that included families with children. Everyone seemed to know all the lyrics, but we had some trouble as newbies, except for the few songs we also knew.

The opening act was a one-man band with the name Skribe. He opened playing a guitar a friend had made for him from an old gasoline can and his drum was a large old suitcase. He also had a guitar made out of a cigar box. Again all instruments were amplified. We were very impressed that he could get all that sound out of these objects and keep it all together musically.

The Rev. Peyton also used some instruments that were recycled, i.e. a gas can, a cigar box, etc. We enjoyed the show and thank DC Blues Society for the opportunity to experience some different blues music.
